soggetto + **am/is/are** + forma base del verbo + **-ing** + ...

Il *Present continuous* si forma con la forma affermativa di **be** seguito dalla forma base del verbo principale + **-ing**.

Forma negativa

soggetto + **am/is/are** + **not** + forma base del verbo + **-ing** + ...

Forma interrogativa

Am/Is/Are + soggetto + forma base del verbo + **-ing** + ... ?

Il *Present continuous* si usa per azioni in corso di svolgimento nel momento in cui si parla o per azioni temporanee.

He is swimming now.

Regole ortografiche

- se il verbo termina con **-e**, si elimina **-e** e si aggiunge **-ing** (**write** > **writing**).
- se il verbo termina con una consonante preceduta da una sola vocale accentata o se termina in **-l**, la consonante finale raddoppia. (**shop** > **shopping** – **get** > **getting** – **travel** > **travelling**).
- se il verbo termina con **-y** aggiunge regolarmente **-ing** (**play** > **playing** – **try** > **trying**).
